- Pledge taking drive: all the staff and students took pledge to create awareness of cleanliness, ensure proper segregation of waste and do shramdaan to create a clean country.




CASE OF THE MONTH

DEPARTMENT OF ORAL MEDICINE AND RADIOLOGY









A 35 years old male patient reported to the department with the complaint of growth in his lower front tooth region since 2 months. He first noticed the growth which was initially smaller in size and gradually increased to the present size in the duration of 2 months. On intra oral examination, A solitary pedunculated exophytic soft tissue growth covering the interdental region & approximately one third of clinical crown of 41 and 42 measuring about 2 x 2.25 cm extending from mesial aspect of 31 to distal aspect of 43 and SI from middle third of crown portion of 41, 31 till the labial vestibule, growth appears pink to deep red in colour and surface appears smooth and shiny. On palpation growth was soft in consistency; non-tender & bleeding was present on stimulus.


On soft tissue examination, white plaque was present on the left buccal vestibule measuring about 2.5x2.5 cm extending superoinferiorly from 1cm below the level of occlusal plane till the buccal vestibule & mediolaterally from distal aspect of 33 till the distal aspect of 35 region and has cracked mud appearance. Lesion was non-scrapable and non-tender which is suggestive of Homogenous leukoplakia.


On hard tissue examination, dental caries i.r.t 47, attrition involving enamel and dentin i.r.t 26, 36, 46 with supragingival calculus and extrinsic stains were present.

Based on the clinical findings, a provisional diagnosis of pyogenic granuloma i.r.t 41, 42 was given. Peripheral ossifying fibroma and Peripheral giant cell granuloma were considered under differential diagnoses. Patient was subjected to radiographic examination, IOPAR i.r.t 41, 42 was done and it revealed horizontal bone loss in between 41 & 42 which is extending till the junction of cervical & middle third of root & also bone loss extending till cervical third of root i.r.t 31, 32 and mesial aspect of 41. The radiograph did not reveal calcifications/ossifications ruling out peripheral ossifying fibroma. Routine blood examination results were found to be within normal limits. Excisional biopsy was done and sent for histopathological examination and the microscopic features were suggestive of pyogenic granuloma in relation to 41 and 42.

OSSIFYING FIBROMA OF RIGHT MANDIBLE

A 11-year-old female patient reported to RRDCH with asymptomatic mandibular swelling on the left side of face that radiographically illustrated a well-circumscribed expansile mass of the left mandibular body region with a sclerotic margin and ground-glass appearance. Incisional biopsy reported as benign fibro-osseous lesion, ossifying fibroma. The patient was treated by segmental mandibulectomy and reconstruction with iliac crest bone graft along with titanium reconstruction plate and screws. Post operative healing was uneventful.

MUCOCELE EXCISION WITH DIODE LASER









Background: Mucocele is the most common lesion of the oral mucosa, which results from the accumulation of mucous secretion due to trauma and lip biting habits or alteration of minor salivary glands. They are mostly of two types based on histological features: extravasation and retention. Mucoceles can appear anywhere in the oral mucosa such as lip, cheeks and the floor of the mouth, but mainly appear in the lip. Diagnosis is mostly based on clinical findings. The most common location of the extravasation mucocele is the lower lip. Mucoceles are mostly seen in young patients but can affect all age groups.

MUCOCELE EXCISION WITH DIODE LASER

They are transparent cystic swellings ranging from the normal colour of oral mucosa to deep blue, soft in consistency and fluctuate on palpation. The treatment of choice is surgical excision.

Case Report: A 33-year old male patient reported to the Department of Periodontology with the complaint of swelling on the lower lip since 2 weeks. The patient first noticed the growth 2 weeks back, which was initially small and gradually increased to the present size. There were associated symptoms such as pus discharge, bleeding, pain or any kind of discomfort. Patient did not have any significant medical history. Clinical examination revealed a well -defined sessile growth measuring about 1.5×1.5 cm present on the lower lip. On palpation, the growth was soft to firm in consistency, immobile and non-tender. Based on clinical findings, a provisional diagnosis of traumatic fibroma involving the lower lip was made. The growth was excised with diode laser and the specimen sent for histopathological examination. The microscopic findings were suggestive of a mucocele. The operated area healed uneventfully with no adverse effects noted.

Conclusion: Diode laser can be used as an alternative to the scalpel for excision of growths in the oral cavity as they have the advantages of ensuring a clearer operating field owing to their better hemostatic control.

ESTHETIC MANAGEMENT OF ELLIS CLASS IV FRACTURE IN PEDIATRIC PATIENT USING CAD-CAM TECHNOLOGY

A female patient aged 13 years reported to the Department of Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry, Rajarajeswari Dental College and Hospital with a chief complaint of pain and discoloration in the upper front tooth region and also complained of poor aesthetics causing difficulty to communicate with peers. Patient has given a history of trauma two years ago resulted in the fracture of the upper front tooth region. Intra oral examination revealed Ellis Class IV fracture in relation to 21 and Ellis Class I fracture in relation to 11. The necessary investigations were done.

Root canal therapy followed by permanent restoration was planned in relation to 21 and composite build up in relation to 11. A multi visit root canal therapy was carried out and considering her age and esthetic concerns, Zirconia crown using CAD-CAM technology was planned and performed. Crown preparation, fabrication and crown cementation using resin modified GIC was successfully completed.

ADVANTAGES OF CAD-CAM TECHNOLOGY

The zirconia crowns fabricated Using CAD-CAM technology have shown high standards of precision, excellent aesthetics, and better mechanical properties such as increased hardness, improved marginal fit, bond strength, and biocompatibility along with decreased delivery time compared to other customized crowns such as PFM and All ceramic crowns.

MANAGEMENT OF MIDLINE DIASTEMA



PRE-OPERATIVE



POST-OPERATIVE

Background: Midline diastema is malocclusion having space in between maxillary or/and mandibular incisors. Maxillary incisors are more commonly affected than mandibular incisors. The growing demand for esthetics has made individuals more aware of the diastema which may be apparent during smiling. Composite restoration is one of the treatment modalities used to close the gap for esthetic concern.

Case Report: A 40 year old patient reported to the department seeking esthetic correction for his gap between the teeth. Medical and Dental histories were not significant. Clinical examination revealed 1mm of gap between maxillary central incisors. Hence, Composite restoration was done.

Conclusion: Composite restoration can be safely and reliably employed to treat Midline diastema.



The Department of Prosthodontics in collaboration of IDA Bengaluru branch, has conducted convention scientific program - Preconvention course on the 22nd of September 2023.



It is a multitasking job for ladies, mother, daughter, wife, daughter in law, home maker and career oriented, but I managed it well, may be spiritual aspect of my personality, practice of yoga, meditation helped me to balance.
